Hampton-Court, July 20.

THIS Day the Baron de Knigge, Envoy from the Duke of Brunfwick Lunenbourg, had a private Audience of Leave of Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal, and their Royal Highnesses the Princesses Amelia and Caroline; to which he was introduced by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.

Hampton-Court, July 23.

On Wednesday last Mr. Baudry, one of His Majesty's Messengers, arrived here from Vienna, being dispatched by Mr. Robinson, His Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at the Imperial Court, with a Treaty signed there the 22d Instant, N. S. by the Ministers of the Emperour, Great Britain and Spain, for the Execution of the Engagements, in Favour of Don Carlos's Succession to the States of Tuscany and Parma, taken by the Treaty of Seville of the 9th of November 1730, N. S. and by the Treaty of Vienna of the 16th of March last.
