Berlin, July 28, N.S. By Letters which came in this Morning from Konigsberg of the 24th Instant, we learn, that his Prussian Majesty was to leave that Place the next Morning very early, and that he will be here on the 30th Instant. On the 15th or 16th of next Month, an Election will be made at Sonnebourg of a Grand Master of the Order of the Knights of St. John, for the District of Brandenbourg, in the Room of the late Margrave Albert, and it is faid the Choice will fall upon his Son the prefent Margrave Charles. At the same Time Count Finkenstein, formerly Governour to the Prince Royal, will be put in Possession of the Commandery va-cant by the Death of M. Cnyphausen. A great Number of new Knights will also be created on this Occasion, amongst whom will be General Ginkel and Colonel Polentz, the Dutch and Saxon Ministers. Apartments are getting ready at the Castle for the Reception of the Margrave and Margravine of Anspach, who are expected here about the Middle of next Month: 'Tis said also, that the Dutchess of Meiningen, his Prussian Majesty's Aunt, will be here about that Time.
