CAPT. Harvey of the Kinsale Man of War belonging to the British Squadron commanded by Sir Charles Wager, which is to attend the Introduction of the Spanish Garrisons into this Country, arrived here the 24th Instant from Parma and Florence. He was dispatched by the Admiral on his Arrival in Alca Bay near Alicante the 6th Instant, with Letters to Mr. Colman, His Britannick Majesty's Minister to the Grand Duke of Tuscany, who was then at Parma, and to Mr. Skinner the British Consul here; and he sailed from hence the 24th to rejoin the Squadron at Barcelona with Answers to those Letters, assuring the Admiral, that the Spanish Troops would be admitted without any Difficulty, the Grand Duke having acceded to the Treaty concluded at Vienna the 22d of July last, between the Emperour and the Crowns of Great Bri-

tain and Spain: Accordingly Preparations are making for the Reception of the Spanish Troops, and there are now in this Town a Commissary from Spain, and another appointed by his Highness, who have been viewing the Quarters, into which such of them are to be placed as are to remain in Garrison here.
