Stockholm, September 22, O. S.

THE Queen has declared, that the King of Sweden will return hither before the End of November. The new President Taube is expected here every Moment from Cassel. On the 16th Instant M. Weber had his Audience of her Swedish Majesty, as Resident from the King of Great Britain as Elector of Hanover.

Berlin, Oct. 6, N. S. Colonel Donop is arrived here from Cassel, being sent by his Swedish Majesty to make his Compliments to the King of Prussia. On Thursday last M. Polentz, the Saxon Minister, set out from hence for his Court.

Brussels, Oct. 10, N. S. Yesterday the States of Brabant met in a general Assembly, to consider of several Proposals made to them, viz. A Demand of the usual yearly Subsidy, and the Continuance of the Excise. A Demand of a Sum of two Millions of Florins to be raised in ten Years, at 200,000 Florins annually, in Conjunction

with the other Provinces of these Countries, for the Rebuilding of a Palace here. And also a Demand that the Abbot of Cauberghe, who is the constant Chaplain to the Court, and has his Abbey adjoining to the Palace, be admitted as a Member of the States of Brabant, as all the other Abbots of the Province are. A Council was held Yesterday, in order to come to a Resolution about the Farming out, or managing to the best Advantage, the Duties of Import and Export, &c. and to consider of the Dutch Resident's Demand, that the first Money that shall be raised, be paid to his Masters in Part of the Arrears of their Subsidies. There was a splendid Appearance Yesterday at the Arch-dutchess's Court, on account of the Anniversary of her most Serene Highness's coming to this Government, which completed six Years.
