My Lords,

I Will forthwith transmit this dutiful and affectionate Address to His Majesty.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses in Parliament assembled.

May it please your Majesty, VI E your Majefty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Ireland in Parliament allembled, with Hearts justly lenfible of your Majesty's great Goodness to us, during the whole Course of your Reign, do on this Occasion most gratefully acknowledge your Royal Favour in committing the Government of this Kingdomy to his Grace the Duke of Dorfet, of whole fincere Inclinations for our Profperity, we are fully convinced, and whole great Honour and reminent Abilities in discharging the Duty of the highest Stations, leave us no room to doubt that

your Majefty's Service, and the Interest and Prosperity of this Nation.

As we hope that our former Conduct hath been agreeable to your Majesty, we allure your Majesty, that we shall, in all our Confultations, endeavour to express that Dury and Affection to your facred Perfon, and that Zeal for your Service and the publick Welfare, which may merit the Continuance of your Royal Approbation.

The great Number of Papifts in Ireland, must at all Times justly alarm your loyal Protestant Subjects; and we shall use our best Endeavours to prevent all Dangers which may arife from them to your Majefty's Government, or the Peace of this Kingdom.

As we are fenfible that the Flaxen and Hempen Manufactures are the most valuable Branches of our Trade, and ablolutely necelfary to the Support of this Kingdom, we shall confider of all proper Methods to carry on and encrease them, and do with the greatest Gratitude acknowledge the Encouragement given by your Majesty to those Manufactures, and in promoting them, depend entirely on your Royal Protection.

We think our Interest inseparable from that of Great Britain, and fhall endeavour, by all Methods in our Power, to prevent the clandeftine Exportation of Wooll into Fo-reign Parts, to prejudicial to the Trade of that Kingdom; and at the fame Time con-fider of the beft Means for the fuppreffing all fraudulent Practices that tend to the Diminution of your Majesty's Revenue, and the Destruction of the fair Trader.

We allure your Majesty, that (as far as we are able in our present Circumstances) we shall grant fuch Supplies as may effectually provide for the Debt of the Nation; and from the just Sense we have that our Interest, Happinels, Religion and Liberties depend entirely on the Effablishment of the Crown in your Majefty and your Royal Houfe, chearfully support your Government with Ho+ nour.

We most gratefully acknowledge your Majefty's great Goodness in taking the prefent Condition of this Kingdom into your Royal Confideration, and ordering Home two of the Regiments upon this Eftablifhment, now in Service Abroad ; and we with the utmost Confidence affure ourselves, that as foon as the Situation of Affairs will permit, you will be gracioufly pleafed to direct the other to be recalled.
