Stockholm, September 29.

THIS Court seems employed about concerting the Preparations for the King of Sweden's Reception; upon which Occasion, the City Train-Bands, Horse and Foot, are to be out, Illuminations to be made throughout the whole Town, and a Fire-work is talked of. Count Meyerfelt set out Yesterday for Pomerania, of which he is Governour, to be in Readiness to do the Honours at Stralsund, through which it is expected his Swedish Majesty will pass, and with whom the Count will return to stay the Winter here, having left his Family behind him.

Copenhagen, Oct. 13, N. S. The King of Sweden has excused his not passing hither on his Return to Stockholm, from the Necessity he is under to visit Pomerania.

Berlin, Oct. 13, N. S. On Wednesday last M. Lewenwolde, the Czarina's Minister, arrived here, and Yesterday he went to Wusterhausen. Colonel Donop, who lately came hither with a Commission from the King of Sweden to the King of Prussia, set out this Morning on his Return to Cassel.

Cassel, Oct. 18, N. S. The King of Sweden being upon his Departure, which continues fixed for the 24th Instant, an Officer of this Court has been sent to Hanover, to regulate with the Grand Marshal the Route his Majesty is to take through the Territories of the King of Great Britain. A great Number of Princes are daily repairing hither to take their Leave of his Majesty, amongst whom are the Duke of Saxe Gotha, the Landgrave of Hesse Darmstadt, the Hereditary Princes their Sons, the Prince of Weissenfels, with others of lesser Note.

Berlin, Oct. 20. On Wednesday Morning M. de Lewenwolde came to Town from Wusterhausen; and as he has taken Leave of the King, 'tis thought he will proceed on his Journey to Vienna in a very few Days. He went this Morning to Potzdam, to see the Regiment of Tall Grenadiers. The King of Poland being on his Departure for Poland, and taking his Way through Crossen, which is in his Prussian Majesty's Dominions, M. Gromkau set out this Morning for that Place, being charged with Compliments to his Polish Majesty, and Orders for defraying the said King's Expence

Expence during his Stay there. Lieutenant General Schwerin is appointed to go to Poland with the Character of his Prussian Majesty's Minister.

Hampton-Court, October 19.

On Saturday last their Majesties and the Royal Family, attended by the Lords and Ladies of the Court, and several of the Nobility and Gentry, took the Diversion of Hunting the Stag in Windfor Forest; at which was present his most Serene Highness the Duke of Lorrain, who goes by the Name of Count Blamont: This Prince afterwards dined here in private with His Majesty, his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and many Persons of Quality; and at Night returned to Iseworth, accompanied by Count Kinsky and General Neubourg. Yesterday in the Evening a Play was acted, called the Recruiting Officer, by His Majesty's Company of Comedians, for the Entertainment of the said Prince.
