*Barcelona, October 15, N. S.*

ON Friday the 12th Instant the Marqués de Mari arrived here from Cadiz with Six large Ships and a Frigate, being Part of the Spanish Fleet which is to attend the Introduction of the Troops of this Nation into Tuscany; and Sig. Cornejo, who has been within Sight of this Place ever since the Marqués's Arrival with the Ships from Galicia, being the remaining Part of which the Fleet is to consist, came to an Anchor here about Nine a-Clock Yesterday Morning. The frequent Calms that we have had in these Seas since the Beginning of this Month, have been the Occasion of their not getting hither sooner. The Spanish Fleet now consists of 20 Men of War, from 48 or 50 Guns, to 80. Upon the Marqués de Mari's Arrival, Orders were immediately sent to the Troops which have been cantoned some Time since in this Neighbourhood, to march immediately to this Place, in order to their Embarkation, which has been carrying on with such Diligence, that they will all be on board To-morrow; and it is expected, the Fleet will put to Sea in the Evening, to take the Advantage of the Land Breeze, which usually blows at that Time.

*Hague, Oct. 30, N. S.* The King of Morocco refusing to ratify the Treaty which had been settled here with Admiral Perez, it has been signified to that Admiral that he might depart from hence; which he did this Morning; and is gone to Amsterdam, there to embark for the Streights. We have Advice, that the King of Poland is set out from Dresden for his Kingdom; and that Sir Luke Schaub was preparing to return to England. He is expected here in a few Days; as is also Major-General Sutton from Caffel.

*Dublin Castle, October 12.*

Yesterday being the Anniversary of their Majesties Coronation, the great Guns were

fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments upon Duty, which were drawn out upon Oxmantown-Green. At Noon there was a very numerous Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction to compliment his Grace the Lord Lieutenant upon that Occasion: After which his Grace, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes, and a Squadron of Horse, made a Tour upon the Strand. In the Evening there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy. A Play was given by his Grace for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and after the Play, there was a Ball at the Castle, and a magnificent Supper in four several Rooms, where a vast Number of Persons of both Sexes were entertained with the utmost Elegance and Regularity.

*Hampton-Court, October 23.*

Yesterday being the Birth-Day of Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal, there was a splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility and Gentry, and Foreign Ministers, who complimented Her Royal Highness on that Occasion. The same Day his most Serene Highness the Duke of Lorrain was entertained at Dinner, with several of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers, in a most magnificent Manner, by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, at Clermont.
