WE have Advice here, that the Tartars of Crim and Budzi, and others in their Neighbourhood, are very much dissatisfied at the new Works which General Taracanoff has been carrying on this Summer, to prevent for the future their making Incurfions; and two or three Couriers are lately arrived here from General Wiesbach, who has the Command in the Ukraine, to inform her Czarish Majesty that the Tartars on the Borders were in Motion; which has occasioned this Court to send an Express to their Minister at Constantinople, to inform himself if those Tartars are not encouraged by the Ottoman Porte. Her Majesty has been pleased to make Major General Shakoffsky a Major of the Simenoffsky Regiment of Guards, and one of her Adjutant Generals: He formerly married a Relation of Prince Menzikoff, and after that Prince's Disgrace, he was sent to the Ukraine, to stay with the Chief Leader of the Cossacks, with whom this Court has always a Gentleman of Distinction to assist him with his Counsel in case of Need. M. Chernishoff, a General Officer, formerly Governour of Riga, is made Great Governour of Moscow, which Place General Soltikoff, her Majesty's late Uncle, had. The Princess Paroskovia, her Majesty's youngest Sister, who has been in a lingering Condition for a long while, is now so very ill, that she is thought past all Hopes of Recovery.

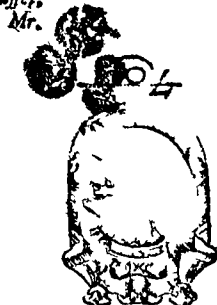
Stockholm, Oct. 20. After the Arrival of the Stralsund Post, which is expected next Friday, it is thought the Queen of Sweden

will fix the Day for the Counts de la Gardie, Bonde, Bielke, and Creutz's setting out, they being the four Senators appointed to meet his Swedish Majesty at Orebro.

Hambourg, Nov. 2, N. S. Letters from Schwerin advise, that the Duke Regent of Mecklenbourg was set out from thence, attended by some Lords of his Court, for Boitzenbourg, in order to receive there the King of Sweden, and to accompany his Swedish Majesty within a certain Distance of Rostock; from whence it is advised, that the Frigate which is designed to carry over his Majesty to Sweden, was arrived at Warnemunde.

Copenhagen, Nov. 3, N. S. The Danish Court is come to Fridericksbourg in this Neighbourhood, where they propose to remain till the End of this Month. General Diering arrived here last Night from Cassel, and is to set out again in a few Days to meet the King of Sweden at Isted. It is thought he is come to return the Compliments carried by M. Hexthausen on the Part of the King of Denmark to his Swedish Majesty, and to excuse his not passing this Way in his Return to Stockholm.
