E have Advice here, that the Tartars of Crim and Budzi, and others in their Neighbourhood, are very much dislatisfied at the hew Works which General Taracanoff has been carrying on this Summer, to prevent for the future their making Incursions; and two or three Couriers are lately arrived here from General Wiesbach, who has the Command in the Ukraine, to inform her Czarish Majesty that the Tartars on the Borders were in Motion; which has occasioned this Court to send an Express to their Minister at Constantinople, to inform himself if those Tartars are not encouraged by the Ottoman Porte. Her Majesty has been pleased to make Major General Shakossky a Major of the Simenoffsky Regiment of Guards, and one of her Adjutant Generals: He formerly married a Relation of Prince Menzikoff, and after that Prince's Difgrace, he was sent to the Ukraine, to stay with the Chief Leader of the Cossacks, with whom this Court has always a Gentleman of Distinction to assist him with his Counsel in case of Need. M. Cherwith his Counsel in case of Need. M. Chernishoff, a General Officer, formerly Governour of Riga, is made Great Governour of Moscow, which Place General Soltiskoff, her Majesty's late Uncle, had. The Princess Paroskovia, her Majesty's youngest Sister, who has been in a lingring Condition for a long while, is now so very ill, that she is thought past all Hopes of Recovery.
