HER Royal Highness the Electoral Princess was happily delivered of a Princess the 4th Instant, who was baptised the same Day, and named Caroline. The young Count of Wackerbarth has entered upon his Employment of Governour to Prince Frederick, eldest Son of his Electoral Highness.

Hambourg, Nov. 9, N. S. Advices from Mecklenbourg say, that on the 3d the King of Sweden entred into that Dutchy, and that the same Day the Duke Regent had an Interview for some Hours with his Swedish Majesty; who afterwards set out by Butzau for Daingarten in Pomerania, where his Majesty was received by the Count de Meyerfeldt, Governour General of that Province. By Letters from Moscow we have Advice, that the Princess Paroskovia, her Czarish Majesty's youngest Sister, died the 8th of last Month, in the Evening, and is very much regretted by her Majesty and all the Court.

Hague, Nov. 13, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland are expected here To-morrow to open their ordinary Assembly, when they are to dispose of the Civil and Military vacant Employments. The Prince of Nassau-Frise arrived here on the 11th in the Evening, where he designs to stay till the latter End of the next Month, when he will set out for Groninguen, to be present at the

changing of the Magistrates there. Yesterday his Highness notified his Arrival to the Presidents of the States General, of the Council of State, and of the Finances, who thereupon complimented him on the Part of the said three Colleges. On Saturday last his Excellency the Earl of Chesterfield, Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of Great Britain, gave a most magnificent Entertainment at Dinner to several Lords of the Regency, to the Foreign Ministers, and to a great Number of Persons of Distinction, on Occasion of the Anniversary of his Britannick Majesty's Birth-day.

Hague, Nov. 16, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland opened their Assembly the 14th Instant, and the Grand Pensionary assisted both Yesterday and to Day. The Deputies of the Admiralties being here, some fresh Conferences have been held with them upon the new Tariff. Major General Sutton arrived here on the 11th Instant, and set out this Morning for Rotterdam, in order to embark on board a Yacht which waits there to carry him over to England.
