### Vienna, November 7, N.S.

HE 2d Inftant a long Conference was held at the Palace; after which feveral Meffengers were difpatched to the Ministers of his Imperial Majefty who are refiding at divers Courts in the Empire. The Aulick Council at War have not yet expedited the Circular Letters for the Reduction of the Imperial Troops, of which Mention has been made. It is now even faid, that this Reduction will not take Place fo foon as was thought, fince we continue with the fame Diligence as heretofore to raife Recruits to compleat the Imperial Regiments, Upon the Reprefentations and Inftances of the Elector of Mentz and of the four affociated Circles, the Emperour has re-folved to caufe a Regulation to be made concerning the March of the Troops, in which the daily Allowance for Soldiers will be fixed upon an equal Foot, and conformable to the Conftitutions of the Empire, in order to prevent all Disputes and Complaints; and it is affured that the Count de Kuffitein will be charged with the Commission of prefenting this Refolution to his Electoral Highnet's. It is faid that the Minister of Genoa at this Court has defired a new Rein-1 forcement of Imperial Troops, in order the Court of Spain, there is Advice, that

to be better enabled to fubdue the Rebels of Corfica : It is alfo faid, that he has complained to the Minister of the Emperour against fome neighbouring Nations, for fupplying the Rebels with Stores of Provisions and Ammunition.

Paris, Aug. 21, N. S. The Queen has named the Count de Teffé, her Gentleman of the Horfe, to go and compliment the Infante Don Carlos upon the Frontiers, and he is to fet out immediately with the Duke de Tallard. The King has been pleafed to confer the Government of Fort Louis on the Marquefs de Rottelin, the Income of which is reduced from 12000 Livres a Year to 7000. On the 19th the Marquess de Castelar, the Grandecs of Spain, and the Knights of the Golden Fleece, went to compliment the young Queen Dowager of Spain on occasion of the Festival of St. Elizabeth, whofe Name the Queen of Spain bears, and they had the Honour to kifs her Hand. The fame Day the Imperial Minister gave a magnificent Entertainment at Supper to all the Foreign Minifters, and feveral Perfons of Diffinction, on occasion of the Festival of the Emprefs's Name; and there was afterwards a Ball.

#### Whitehall, November 16.

By the last Letters from Mr. Keene, His Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at the the King of Spain has nominated the Junder-mentioned, to the Times against their Names ex-Marquess de Montejo to be his Ambassadour to His Majesty, and that he was accordingly preparing for his Journey to England. This Day Letters came in from Sir Charles Wager, dated at Leghorn the 26th of last Month, O. S. which give an Account, that every thing relating to the Introduction of the Spanish Garrifons into Tufcany being finished to the Satisfaction of all the Parties concerned, he was getting under Sail with His Majefty's Squadron under his Command, in order to return home : And Mr. Skinner, His Majesty's Conful at Leghorn, in his Letter dated the next Day, fays, that they were out of Sight that Morning, and though the Wind was not very favourable, the Weather being good, they would make their Way homeward. Before Sir Charles Wager left Leghorn, he fent a Compliment to the Grand Duke at Florence, and an Excuse for not attending him in Person, on account of the advanced Seafon's making it neceffary for him to haften his Departure home. The Lord Vere Beau-clerc went with this Meffage to the Grand Duke, by whom his Lordship was very gracioully received.

#### Whitehall, November 16.

On Sunday the 7th Initant Major Ge-neral Sutton, His Majcíty's Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Sweden as Landgrave of Heffe-Caffel, embarked at Rotterdam on boart His Majesty's Yacht the William and Mary, and arrived at Greenwich on Saturday laft in the Evening, and came to London the next Morning, and waited immediately on their Majesties, who received him very graciouily. Yesterday he waited on his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.
