OME Days ago the Council of State in a Body having presented to the States General the Estimate and Establishment of the Number of Forces to be kept up by this State for the ensuing Year, being the same as for the last, it is now under the Consideration of the States of Holland, who refumed their Affembly this Day: It has been likewife fent to the respective Provinces for their Approbation. Count Golofkin has Advice, that the Czarina has nominated an Ambassadour to go to the Court of Great Britain.
