Berlin, January 5, N. S.

ON Tuesday last the King of Prussia removed from hence to Potzdam, as the Queen will do To-morrow, and continue there till the Time of the Reviews. The Prince and Princess of Bareith accompany her Majesty to Potzdam, from whence they set out on Wednesday next for Bareith.

Hague, Jan. 11, N. S. The Grand Pensionary was Yesterday and this Morning at the Assembly of the States of Holland, when the last Dispatches from Vienna, communicated by Count Sinzendorff, were taken into Consideration: The said States separate To-morrow, to go and consult afresh their respective Towns, and return next Week. The Duke of Lorrain has been obliged to stay several Days at Wesel, the Rhine not being passable by reason of the bad Weather. M. de Ginkel's Departure for Berlin, is put off for eight Days longer.
