Yesterday in the Afternoon the Duke of Lorraine was expected at Potsdam, and all the Foreign and most of the Prussian Ministers are gone thither to compliment his most Serene Highness on his Arrival, and great Preparations are making to entertain him. 'Tis said the Prince Royal of Prussia is also expected there from Custrin. His Royal Highness has obtained Major General Goltz's Regiment, which is to be clothed as the King's own Regiment, with this Difference only, that the Loops of the Prince's Regiment are to be Silver, whereas those of the King's are Gold.

Hague, Feb: 22, N. S. We have an Account here to Day, that the Duke of Lorraine, in his Way to Potsdam, the Night between the 14th and 15th Instant, was fallen sick of a violent Fever and a sore Throat. The States of Holland continue their Assembly and Deliberations upon their domestick Affairs. His Excellency the Earl of Chesterfield designs to take his Leave of the States in a Day or two, in order to go on board the William and Mary Yacht at Rotterdam by To-morrow Sennight.
