*Hague, March 14, N. S.*

**T**HE Consent of the States of Groningen to the Act of Concurrence of the States General to the Treaty of Vienna, concluded the 16th of March 1731, N. S. arrived here this Morning, and their Deputies are authorized to ratify the same. The States of Holland are assembled chiefly for the Disposal of the Civil and Military Employments vacant in their Department. The Regiment of Horse of the late General Cralingen, has been given to Brigadier de Boncourt.

*Dublin, March 1.*

This being Her Majesty's Birth-Day, the great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty, which were drawn out upon Oxmantown-Green. At Noon there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance at the Castle of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment his Grace the Lord Lieutenant, before whom a Song was performed; after which his Grace, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes, and a Squadron of Dragoons, made a Tour on the Strand. At Night there was a Play given by his Grace for the Entertainment of the Ladies, and afterwards an Entertainment and Ball at the Castle; and there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other usual Demonstrations of Joy.
