L E T T E R S from Breslau say, that the Duke of Lorrain was expected there, on his Principality of Teschen in Silesia, on the 19th Instant. His Serene Highness is likewise expected here very shortly. The Turkish Aga set out the 22d Instant with a Guard of 50 Soldiers and an Officer, on his Return to Constantinople : We do not yet hear of any Person's being named to succeed him. It is not yet certain that his Imperial Majesty goes to Carlsbad this Year ; but if he does, it will be with as small a Retinue as can be. There happened a Fire this Morning at the House of the Countess of Stahrenberg, (who is the Widow of the late Ambassadour at the Court of Great Britain) but by timely Assistance it did no great Damage. Count Lagnasco set out Yesterday for Warsaw. We hear that an Officer of Rank is appointed to go to Berlin, to return the Compliments sent from thence hither by Count Schulemburg, upon the Marriage of the Prince Royal with a Princess of Bevern.

Berlin, April 1, N. S. The King of Prussia has lately published an Edict in Prussia, ordering a certain Sect of Anabaptists called Menonists, to withdraw with their Families and Effects out of his Dominions within three Months. The Court of Bevern left Potzdam this Morning on their return Home. M. Wakholtz, a Lieutenant Colonel in the

Electors of Cologne's Service, has been taken up by Order of his Prussian Majesty : He is under an Arrest at Potzdam, whither he came to desire the King of Prussia (whose Vassal he is, having some Lands in Pomerania) to place one of his Sons in the Company of Cadets. The King granted his Request, but signified to him, that as to himself he should remain a Prisoner, as a Reprisal for the ill Usage which his Prussian Majesty's Officers constantly meet with in the Elector his Master's Dominions :

Copenhagen, April 1, N. S. There seems to be no doubt concerning the King of Denmark's intended Voyage to Norway ; all due Preparations are made and Orders given to that Purpose ; only the Day of his Majesty's Departure is not yet fixed. But the Review of the Regiments in Garrison at this Place being to begin on the 18th Instant, it is probable the King, having nothing more to detain him here, will set out very soon after that is over. Yesterday was the Birth Day of the Prince Royal, who is now entered into his Tenth Year. He is a very promising Prince, of great Vivacity, and a ready just Apprehension ; his Person is agreeable, and his Carriage extremely easy and graceful for one of his Age.
