HIS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Charles Dalton, Gentleman-Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Messāge from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to,

An Act for granting an Aid to his Majesty by a Land Tax to be raised in Great Britain for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Thirty Two.

An Act for revising the Duties on Salt for the Term therein mentioned.

An Act for the more easy Recovery of Debts in his Majesty's Plantations and Colonies in America.

An Act to explain an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intitled, An Act for importing from his Majesty's Plantations in America directly into Ireland, Goods not enumerated in any Act of Parliament, so far as the said Act relates to the Importation of foreign Hops into Ireland.

An Act for providing a Recompence to Sir Thomas Lembe for discovering and introducing the Arts of making and working the three capital Italian Engines for

making Organzine Silk, and for preserving the Invention for the Benefit of this Kingdom.

And to Four private Bills.

Vienna, March 29, N. S. M. de Linden, Lieutenant Colonel of Prince Eugette's Regiment, set out the 27th Instant for Berlin, to compliment that Court upon the Marriage of the Prince Royal of Prussia with the Princess of Bevern; and Count Shulenburg, who brought hither the News of that Match, had Yesterday his Audiences of Leave of their Imperial Majesties. His Highness the Bishop of Bamberg and Wutzbourg has great Hopes of being shortly declared Coadjutor of the Archbishoprick of Mentz. It has been publicly declared at Court, that the Duke of Lorraine is to be appointed Viceroy of Palatine of Hungary, and some will have it that even his Imperial Majesty will go to Presburg himself to settle that Business at the Diet there.

Berlin, April 3, N. S. Count Aspremont de Linden, Chamberlain to the Emperour, and a great Favourite of Prince Eugene's, arrived here two Days ago from Vienna, being charged with Compliments from their Imperial Majesties to the King and Queen of Prussia, upon the Prince Royal's Espousals with the Princess of Bevern.
