**A** Placart has been lately published here, erecting a Company of Merchants for the exclusive Exportation of Copper upon the sole Account of this Crown, which is with a View to bring in Silver, in order to increase the Quantity of that Specie, which is very scarce; and another is soon expected to specify the Particulars of those Prohibitions, which were reserved in a former one.

*Berlin, April 15, N. S.* Count Aspremont de Linden is come back from the Court of Wolfenbittel. He went Yesterday to Potsdam to take Leave of his Prussian Majesty, and in a Day or two will set out on his Return to Vienna. Orders have been given in the Principality of Halberstadt, to take up and confine all the Hessian Officers of what Rank soever they be, that shall happen to travel through that Country, which they say is done by way of Reprizals for one Major Quade, belonging to the Prince Royal's Regiment, who is in Arrest at Cassel, for some unwarrantable Practices in recruiting.

*Hambourg, April 18, N. S.* Prince William of Hesse Cassel is expected here the Beginning of next Month in his Way to Stockholm.

*Berlin, April 19, N. S.* On Thursday last M. de Seckendorff, Minister from the Emperour of Germany, went to Potsdam, and after having had a very long Audience of the King, set out that Evening for the Court of Wolfenbittel, from whence it is as-

sured he goes to Cassel, to try to make up the Differences between that Court and this, on Account of the Violences committed by the Prussian Recruiters. We have now certain Advices from Breslau, that the Elector of Mentz died on the 10th Instant.
