A PROCLAMATION,

For preventing the illegal Exportation of Wooll, Worstead, Bay or Woollen Yarn, Woothen Cloth, or other Wcollen Manu-factures of this Kingdom.

OR SET.

OR the more effectual preventing the illegal Exportation of Wooll, Worstead, Eay or Woollen Yam, Woollen Cloth, or other Woollen Manufactures of this Kingdom; We the Lord Lieutenant and Council, do by this our Proclamation, strictly command and require, that all the Laws in force in this Kingdom for restraining the Exportation of Wooll, Worstead, Bay or Woollen Yain, Woollen Cloth, or other Woollen Manusactures be duly put in Execution, and that all Offenders against the same be proceeded against, and punished according to Law, without any favour to be extended to any of them.

And we do hereby strictly sorbid all his Majesty's Subjects, to export any Wooll, Worstead, Bay or Woollen Yarn, Woollen Cloth, or other Woollen Manusactures out of this Kingdom into any Foreign Parts, but in such Manner as is directed by the several Laws and Statutes in force in this Realm,

And we do further hereby will and require all Justices of Peace, Sheriffs, and the Commissioners of his Majesty's Revenue in this Kingdom, and all Collectors, Searchers, Waiters, Officers of his Majesty's Revenue, and other Officers Civil and Military, and all other his Majesty's loving Subjects, that they use their utmost care and diligence, to hinder and prevent any fuch illegal Exportation.
