A PROCLAMATION,

For preventing the illegal Exportation of Wooll, Worstead, Bay or Woollen Yarn, Woollen Cloth, or other Woollen Manufactures of this Kingdom.

DORSET.

FOR the more effectual preventing the illegal Exportation of Wooll, Worstead, Bay or Woollen Yarn, Woollen Cloth, or other Woollen Manufactures of this Kingdom; We the Lord Lieutenant and Council, do by this our Proclamation, strictly command and require, that all the Laws in force in this Kingdom for restraining the Exportation of Wooll, Worstead, Bay or Woollen Yarn, Woollen Cloth, or other Woollen Manufactures be duly put in Execution, and that all Offenders against the same be proceeded against, and punished according to Law, without any favour to be extended to any of them.

And we do hereby strictly forbid all his Majesty's Subjects, to export any Wooll, Worstead, Bay or Woollen Yarn, Woollen Cloth, or other Woollen Manufactures out of this Kingdom into any Foreign Parts, but in such Manner as is directed by the several Laws and Statutes in force in this Realm.

And we do further hereby will and require all Justices of Peace, Sheriffs, and the Commissioners of his Majesty's Revenue in this Kingdom, and all Collectors, Searchers, Waiters, Officers of his Majesty's Revenue, and other Officers Civil and Military, and all other his Majesty's loving Subjects, that they use their utmost care and diligence, to hinder and prevent any such illegal Exportation.

GOD Save the KING.

Vienna, April 16, N. S. On the 12th Instant a long Conference was held relating to the Affairs of Hungary, and it is said that the Installment of the Duke of Lorraine at Presburg is fixed for the 10th of next Month; and about the same Time M. d'Albrecht will set out for Portugal, with the Character of his Imperial Majesty's Minister to that Court. Yesterday his Imperial Majesty created two Knights of the Golden Fleece, viz. the Prince de Santa Croce, and General Alcaudette. This Evening the Duke of Lorraine arrived at the Palace Favorita, where his Highness was received by his Imperial Majesty with the greatest Marks of Friendship. A great Number of the Nobility went as far as New-Schonborn to meet him and accompany him hither. Great Preparations have been made here as well as at Laxembourg for his Reception. His Imperial Majesty's Journey to Carelsbad is fixed for the 25th of next Month.

Master of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of the Queen, in her Majesty's Apartment; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Grantham her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.
