Petersbourg, April 4, O. S.

A Courier arrived here Yesterday from Persia, with the agreeable News, that Baron Schaffiroff had at last concluded a Treaty of Peace between her Czarish Majesty and the Sophy of Persia.

Stockholm, April 12, O. S. M. Bestuchef, Minister from the Czarina, had his Audience of their Swedish Majesties on the 10th Instant. The Dutchess Dowager of Mecklenbourg being upon her Return to Germany, has fixed her Departure to the 25th Instant, when his Swedish Majesty will probably accompany her some Part of the Way.

Dresden, April 29, N. S. Mr. Woodward, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Great Britain, arrived here the 26th Instant, and is preparing to proceed on his Journey to Warlaw.

Hague, May 6, N. S. The States of Holland continue their Assembly. 'Tis hoped that the Difficulties relating to a Reduction of Troops will be removed, the Province of Gelderland having writ a very pressing Letter to represent the Necessity of continuing the State of War as it is; to which the said Province, Overysse and Friesland have sent their Consent. Count Golofkin, Minister from the Czarina, has received Advice from his Court, that a Peace is concluded between the Czarina and the Persians.
