*Petersbourg, April 11, O. S.*

**T**HIS Court continues to rejoyce very much at the Conclusion of the late Treaty between her Czarish Majesty and the Persians, which they look upon as very advantageous to Russia; for though her Majesty is to yield to the Sophy the Province of Ghilan, nevertheless she keeps the Towns of Baku, Derbent, and St. Croix, which are three fortified Places on the Caspian Sea, by which the Russians will always be able to make Incurfions either on the Persians or Turks, or assist either of those Powers, in case their Interest require it. By this Treaty the Russians are to have free Liberty to trade not only over all Persia without paying any Custom, but also to send Caravans thro' that Country to India. This last Privilege was granted them by the Treaty they made with Sultan Esreff, but they have not yet sent any Caravans to India, which they say now they design to do. The 2d Instant died the Lord Duffus, who was a Rear Admiral in this Service. The 9th Instant her Czarish Majesty was pleased to declare Count Gallowin a Vice Admiral, and at the same Time made him a Knight of St. Alexander.

*Hambourg, May 9, N. S.* Yesterday the Magistrates of this City complimented the Bishop of Lubeck by a Deputation, upon his happy Recovery from his late Illness, and they made his Highness at the same Time a Present of a considerable Quantity of Rhe-

nish and Moselle Wines. The Duke of Holstein is at a Country Seat belonging to his Highness in this Neighbourhood. We have Advices here from Cassel, that Prince William of Hesse's Journey to Sweden is suspended.
