HIS Court continues to rejoyce very much at the Conclusion of the late Treaty between her Czarish Majesty and the Persians, which they look upon as very advantageous to Ruffia; for though her Majefty is to yield to the Sophy the Province of Ghilan, nevertheless the keeps the Towns of Baku, Derbent, and St. Croix, which are three fortified Places on the Cafpian Sea, by which the Ruffians will always be able to make Incurfions either on the Persians or Turks, or affist either of those Powers, in cafe their Interest require it. By this Treaty the Rullians are to have free Liberty to trade not only over all Perfia without paying any Cuftor, but allo to fend Caravans thro' that Country to India. This laft Privilege was granted them by the Treaty they made with Sultan Effeff, but they have not yet fent any Caravans to India, which they fay now they defign to do. The 2d Infant died the Lord Duffus, who was a Rear Admiral in this Service. The 9th Instant her Czarish Majesty was pleased to declare Count Gallo-win a Vice Admiral, and at the same Time

made him a Knight of St. Alexander. Hambourg, May 9, N. S. Yefterday the Magiltrates of this City complimented the Biftop of Lubeck by a Deputation, upon his happy Recovery from his late Illnels, and they made his Highness at the same Time a Prefent of a confiderable Quantity of Rhe-

nifh and Molelle Wines. 'The Duke of Holstein is at a Country Seat belonging to his Highness in this Neighbourhood. We have Advices here from Callel, that Prince Wil-liam of Heffe's Journey to Sweden is fulpended.
