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Harwich, September 2.

BY several passengers arrived here this morning from *Holland*, we are told, that the Burgers of the *Briel* have displaced all their old Magistrates, and had thereupon sent their Deputies to the *Hague*, to pray the Prince of *Orange* to appoint others in their steads, that the said Deputies returned home on Thursday last, with this answer, That his Highness would have a care of them, and gratify them in this particular, so soon as he could have any leisure so to do, he being at present extremely pressed with the dispatch of many affairs of very high importance to the State. That the Dutch Fleet were seen off of the *Maes* on Friday and Saturday last.

Milan, Aug. 14. All thoughts of an accommodation between the Duke of *Savoy* and the State of *Genova*, seem now to be wholly laid aside, and instead thereof, each party is onely busied how best to carry on the War. Our Governour it is said, has received Orders from the Queen Regent, not to permit any Leavies to be made in this Dutchy, or to afford any other assistance to either Party, her Majesties intentions being to remain Neuter in this present quarrel; It is said here, that his most Christian Majesty will Declare for the Duke of *Savoy*, and assist him as well with his Forces by Land as Sea, but of this there is not as yet any certainty. Signior *Spada* is suddenly expected at *Turin*, in quality of Nuncio from the Pope, to endeavor a composition of the present differences.

Dantzick, Aug. 27. Letters of the 12 instant from *Limbergh* tell us, that the Grand Vizier was for certain at *Cochozyn*, and was making a Bridg over the River *Nestre*, which part of the Army had already passed, and had taken possession of a Castle called *Zwanietz*, lying over against *Cochozyn*, which was quitted by the Poles, they being fled to *Kaminietz*, which place is besieged by the Enemy, and though of great strength, yet is feared, will not be able to hold out long for want of Provisions, there being so many fled thither that it is thought, they have not enough for eight days time. We are told, that *Podolia*, *Volinia*, and *Russia*, have desired protection from the Turks, which if true, the *Ukraine* is certainly lost, and *Poland* in a sad condition; Many people are already fled from *Limbergh*. The King is at *Fanowits*, about 12 Miles from *Warsaw*, expecting there the appearance of the Militia of the Kingdom, who dare not now Rendezvous at *Sokal*, as was at first ordered, the Enemy being come so near them. The remainder of the Polish Army, which is not now above 3000 Men, is retired towards *Limbergh*, where the Crown-Generall is endeavoring to recruit them, but it is feared too late.

Posszept. Letters come this day from *Warsaw* dated 22 instant say, that the Turks had twice stormed *Caminietz*, but were beaten off with great loss, and had left it, and had taken their march towards *Limbergh*, which had caused great terror in all the parts thereabouts.

Muesbricht, Sept. 2. In our last we told you, that the French Forces were all broken up from before this

place; That those Troops which lay quartered at *Wycke*, marched over the great Heath to *Maseyck* and the others round by *Navagne* towards *Viset*, it being then reported, that they would take their way towards *France* and *Lorraine*; but yesterday about seven in the Morning, we were again alarmed with the news of the approach of the Enemy, which were the French Troops returning from *Viset*, being in all 6000 Men, Horse and Foot, they passed through *Gronsvelt*, and came within sight of this place, and so proceeded to *Meerssen*, where they passed the *Guele*, and so marched on towards *Maseycke*. The Troops which on Tuesday and Wednesday last lay at *Zuwendael* and *Bessemer*, under the Command of the Marquis de *Vaubran*, are likewise marched through *Kempeland* towards *Maseycke*, where it seems they intend to bring together a very considerable Body of Men, and then, as is said here, to move towards the *Rhyn*.

Cologne, Sept. 2. From *Egra* in *Bohemia* we have advice, that the 23 instant arrived there General *Montecuculi* and Prince *Charles* of *Lorraine* from *Vienna*; That the next day was the general Rendezvous of the Imperial Troops there, who the 25 began their march towards *Halberstadt*, which place it is thought, they will now reach within few days, This day the Elector of *Brandenburgh* intended to be at *Minden*, on his way to *Halberstadt*, whither the Duke of *Lorraine* we hear is likewise gone.

Gronningen, Sept. 3. The Bishop of *Munster* is removed with his Forces from *Helpen*, so that we are now freed from all fears of the Enemy. From *Leevaerden* they write, that having advice of the Enemies retreat, they had marched out with 300 Horse; and fallen upon their Rear, and had done considerable execution, having brought back with them several prisoners with some plunder, though it is thought, they make this small advantage much greater then indeed it was.

Rotterdam, Sept. 6. Things seem as yet very much unsettled; At *Delf* the Burghers yesterday drove their Magistrates from the Town-House, together with the Secretary and other publick Officers whom they then discharged their several Employments; At the *Hague* it is said, the Burghers are ready to do the like, and that the Sheriff there, had desired leave of the Prince of *Orange* to question those persons which were the Authors of the death of the two *de Wits*, which obtaining, that he had sent for the several Captains of the Burghers, demanding of them who they were, that murdered the said *de Wits*, to which they replied, we All, and that if he were not satisfied with it, they would serve him in the same kind; however, they immediately turned him out of his office, telling him, they were very kind they did not use him worse. Our Forces we hear have retaken *Blockzeil*, and another small Fort in *Friesland*.

We are told of a skirmish that hath happened between our Troops and a party of the French near *Woerden*, though without any considerable advantage on either side. We hear that the Velt Marechal *Wurtz* had lately been abroad with some Forces in order to the surprizing *Creveceur*, but that his design
