*Petersbourg, April 25, O. S.*

A Courier is lately arrived here from Persia, with the News that the Turks and Persians had signed a Peace at Babylon, and that the Turks were to keep Georgia, but were to give up to the Persians the Province and Town of Tauris. Count Levenvolde, who has been so long expected, arrived here the 19th Instant from the Courts of Vienna and Berlin. A Courier is arrived here from Constantinople, with the News that the Grand Vizier is deposed. Preparations are making for the Czarina's Voyage to Revel and Riga; and there is great Likelihood that her Majesty will not return soon to Moscow.

*Vienna, May 14, N. S.* The Emperour was in Town on the 12th, to assist at a Procession; the next Day was the Eldest Arch-dutchess's Birth-Day, on which her Highness entred into her 16th Year; and to Day the Emperour will come again hither to assist at the Funeral Obsequies for the late Elector of Mentz. The Emperour has appointed the following Lords to attend him to Carelsbad in Quality of his Gentlemen of the Bed Chamber, viz. the Counts Gundemar de Stahrenberg, Juliani, Eril, Pefora, de Kevenhuller, Sebasilla, Charles d'Harrach, and Sangro. This Journey is fixed for the 27th Instant. The young Count d'Harrach is named to go in Quality of Imperial Commissary, to assist at the Election of a new Grand Master of the Teutonick Order, which is to be at Mergentheim. The Duke of Lorrain having writ to the French King, to notify to him that the Emperour had declared him Viceroy of Hungary, his most Christian Majesty has, as it is said, answered his Highness, and congratulated him on that Dignity. This Prince assists very frequently at the Conferences which are held at Laxembourg.

*Hague, May 27, N. S.* The States General resolved Yesterday to form an Encampment this Summer of a Body of Troops in the Neighbourhood of Nimeguen or Breda, and their Resolution was sent Yesterday to the several Provinces for their Consent. Orders are given for supplying the Magazines of Nimeguen with necessary Stores of Ammunition and Provisions, as likewise the other Places upon the Maese, whose Fortifications are to be forthwith repaired, in order to put them in a Condition of Defence against all Events. The Assembly of the States of Holland remains fixed for To-morrow. The Commissioners of the Admiralty are still here.
