N the 4th Inftant the General Affembly of the Church of Scotland met at Edinburgh, and chose for their Moderator Mr. Neil Campbell, Prin-cipal of the Univerfity of Glafgow. His Majesty's Committion constituting the Right Honourable the Marquess of Lothian His Majesty's High Commilfioner was read ; as was also His Majesty's most gracious Letter to the General Aslembly. His Majesty's High Commiffioner made a Speech to the Aflembly; to which the Moderator in their Name returned a very respectful Answer. Then a Committee being appointed, drew up a most loyal and dutiful Answer to His Majesty's most gracious Letter ; which Anfwer was unanimoufly agreed to on the 6th ; and having been tranfmitted to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, has by him been laid before His Majefty.

May it pleafe your Majesty, YOUR Majesty being pleased in your most gracious Letter to us, kindly to express your Satisfaction with the Zeal and Loyalty of our former Affemblies, and their Affec-tion to your Perfon, Royal Family, and Go-vernment, is a great Pleafure to us, and cannot but engage us carefully to follow the fame dutiful Measures in this Meeting.

We effeem it our great Happiness, that we have a Sovereign upon the Throne, who recommends to us the purluing of fo high and good Ends, as the Glory of God, the Peace of the Church, and the Welfare of our Country; and that your Majesty is graciously plea-fed, from a Perswasion of our Regard to these Ends, willingly to countenance our Meeting with your Royal Authority, and to renew on this Occasion the Assurances which you have formerly given us, of your fixt Purpole and Refolution to maintain this Church, as it is eftablished by Law, in the full and free Poffeffion and Enjoyment of all its just Rights and Privileges, which we most thankfully acknowledge, and prefume with Confidence to rely upon.

The promoting of true Religion and Virtue, the preventing the Growth of Popery, and suppressing of Profaneness and Immorality, we hope, shall always be the great Subject

and Defign of our Confultations; for the acl complifhing of these valuable Ends, we are fenfible how much (under God) we need your Majefty's Royal Protection and Encouragement, upon which (we blefs God) your Ma-jefty is gracioufly pleafed to allow us always to depend.

Your Majefty's expressing such Confidence in our Wiflom and Frudence, is doing us the greatest Honour; and we hope, through the Divine Affistance, that our Debates and Proceedings shall be conducted with that Moderation and Calmness, and that Brotherly Love and Charity, which becomes fuch a Body, and which are necessary to fecure the Success of our Counfels and Measures. And we efteem it an Evidence of your Majefty's great Goodnefs, that our Behaviour in a Manner fo agreeable to our Duty and Interest, will recommend us to your Royal Favour.

The Choice your Majesty has made of the most Honourable the Marquess of Lothian, to represent your Royal Person in this Assembly, is most acceptable to us, who are fully fatisfied of his Loyalty and Zeal for your Majefty's Service, of his Affection and Concern for this Church, and firm Adherence to its Principles, and of his Abilities for the Difcharge of fo great a Truft : All which justly oblige us to efteem this Choice, as a new and great Mark of your Majefty's Royal Favour to us; and we beg leave to allure your Majefty, that nothing thall be wanting on our Part, to make the Discharge of his high Trust easy and agreeable to him.

We humbly prefume to take this Opportunity of acknowledging, with the greatest Thankfulness, your Majesty's Royal Bounty in renewing your pious and charitable Donation, for the Reformation of the Highlands and Iflands. It is with great Pleasure that we can affure your Majesty, that the Application thereof in former Years, hath produced very good Effects, and we hope it shall still produce more; and for that E-1, it shall be our Care, faithfully to employ it to the good and laudable Purpoles for which your Majesty hath been pleased to grant it, and in an exact Con-formity to your Majesty's Royal Orders.

May our gracious God, who hath placed your Majesty upon the Throne of your Anceftors, as a great Bleffing to these your Dominions, and to all the Protestant Churches, long pielerve you to reign over us, and bleQ youy
