THE States of the Province of Holland, who assembled the Beginning of last Week, had resolved to separate on Saturday last for eight or ten Days, on account of the Indisposition of the Great Pensionary, which hindered him from attending them; but finding himself pretty well recovered that Day, he desired them to continue their Session, which they agreed to, and he has been well enough to assist in their Assembly to Day. The said States of Holland, as also most of the other Provinces, have consented to the proposed Incampment, which is not design'd to be formed till September next, and is to be upon the Heath of Ooster-Hour, between Bolduc and Breda. It is to be composed of Troops which are to be drawn out of the neighbouring Places to the Number of about 10000 Men, under the Command of General Hompefch, who is to have with him some Lieutenants General, Majors General, and Brigadiers. It being advised that the King of Prussia designs to go to Carlsbad when the Emperour shall be there, the States have sent Orders to M. de Ginkel to repair thither about the same Time, and have also sent him Credential Letters for transacting Affairs with his Imperial Majesty, in case M. Bruyninx, who has been sick, should not be in a Condition to make the Journey to Carlsbad.
