Sheerneck, June 7.

Yesterday the Mayor, Jurats, and Bailiffs of the Corporation of Queenborough paid their Duty to his Majesty on board the Carolina Yacht, were most graciously received, and had the Honour to kiss his Majesty's Hand. The Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Torrington, the Right Honourable the Lord Harrington, and the Right Honourable the Lord De la War, were unanimously admitted Free Burgeses of the said Corporation. Captain Cracherode, Captain Commandant of this Garrison, had the Honour, together with the rest of the Military Officers, to pay their most humble Duty to his Majesty on board the Carolina Yacht, and to kiss his Majesty's Hand. The Wind being little, at East, this Morning, the Lord Torrington caused the Signals for weighing to be made, and at Half an Hour past Nine a-Clock, the King was saluted from this Fort on his passing by to the Nore.

Sheerneck, June 8. Early this Morning a Vessel hath brought Advice hither; that, between Nine and Ten last Night, the Fleet was failing from the Gunnfleet, after having been at an Anchor there about an Hour or two; and that the Wind was gentle at South East.
