Cádiz, June 3, N. S.

ON the 30th past, the first Bales of Merchandize for the Loading of the Flota were sent on board. Two Dutch Men of War are arrived here from Holland, in their Way to the Streights.

Hague, June 20, N. S. The Deputies of the States of Holland separated last Saturday, and went to their respective Towns to take their Opinion of the Means that may be proper to be used for repairing the Timber-Works which serve to secure the Diques or Sea-Banks of North-Holland; and to Day they re-assembled, in order to come to a final Resolution upon that Affair in a Day or two: After which they will adjourn to the 16th of next Month. Count Sinzendorf, the Emperor's Envoy, sets out next Week in order to attend the Imperial Court at Carlsbad. Letters from Berlin advise, that it is now uncertain whether his Prussian Majesty will make a Journey to Carlsbad. M. van Hoey, Ambassador of the States General at the Court of France, is expected here in a few Days, having obtained Leave of their High Mightinesses to come hither for a little Time on his own Affairs.

Hague, June 24, N. S. The King of Great Britain landed at Helvoetsluys the 21st, about Three in the Afternoon, and went to Utrecht, where his Majesty lay that Night. The next Morning about Nine a-Clock his Majesty proceeded from thence on his Journey to Hanover, where it is reckoned his Majesty will arrive to Day. The Lord Harrington came hither the 21st, and this Morning set out for Utrecht.
