**O**N Saturday the 21st of last Month his Majesty landed at Helvoetsluys about Three in the Afternoon, and immediately went in a Coach for Newsluys, where one of the Yachts of the States General was attending in order to carry his Majesty to Schiedam; but the Wind and Tide being both contrary, his Majesty went into a Four Oar Boat, which landed him at Schiedam about Nine in the Evening; his own Coach and Horses waiting there, his Majesty proceeded forthwith, and passed through Rotterdam about Ten at Night, where he was saluted by a triple Discharge of the Cannon from the Boomkeys, and came to Utrecht after Midnight, and rested at M. Pouchoud's. The next Morning about Eight his Majesty set out from thence, and came to Delden at Nine in the Evening, where he supped and rested that Night. The next Morning, being Monday the 23d, his Majesty set forward about Five, and came to Bentham about Nine, where his Majesty was likewise saluted by a triple Discharge of the Cannon from the Castle; to which Place his Majesty was attended by a Party of the Dutch Guards from Station to Station, where they were relieved by a Party of Dragoons of his own Troops, who escorted his Majesty to his own House at Dippenau, where his Majesty arrived about Seven in the Evening, and was received there by a great many of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, who were come thither to compliment him on his safe Arrival in his German Dominions, and was also attended there by three Troops of Brigadier General Wendt's Dragoons. His Majesty supped and lay there that Night, and the next Morning, being Tuesday the 24th, his Majesty reviewed the said three Troops, who performed the manual Exercise on Foot, and went through the Evolutions with great Dexterity and Exactness, with which his Majesty was well pleased. They made a very fine Appearance, being new clothed. His Majesty afterwards set out, escorted by a fresh Party of Dragoons, for Herenhausen, where he arrived that Day between Two and Three a-Clock in the Afternoon, in perfect Health, and was received and complimented by the Lords of the Regency, and a great Number of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction.

On Sunday last in the Morning, the Right Honourable the Lord Harrington, arrived here, and waited on his Majesty at Herenhausen.

Thomas Robinson, Esq; his Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary to the Court of Vienna,

having obtained the King's Leave to wait on him at this Place, arrived here some Days before his Majesty.

Last Night Count Rantzau, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark to the Court of Great Britain, arrived here from England.

Yesterday in the Evening a French Comedy was acted at the Theatre in Herenhausen Gardens.
