finish'd the whole Debarcation, except that of a few Horse belonging to the Prince's Regiment; that as the first 6000 Men were landing, they saw about 600 Moorish Horse and some Peasants, upon which the General detached Don Lucas Patino with three Companies of Grenadiers, and Don Juan Pizuela with 200 Horse, but the Moors fled from them, and killed two Grenadiers who advanced further than the rest, and wounded three others, which is all the Loss the Spaniards have sustained; that the Moors upon the Mountains confift of about 17000 Men; but as they did not fall upon the first Party of Spaniards that landed, the Count Montemar did not expect to find any other Opposition than what he should meet with the next Day in attacking the Fort of Mazalquivir, which being cut into a Rock, and so low that it cannot be battered in Breach, is thought to be capable, with about 400 Turks, and Provisions in Proportion, to employ the Spaniards all the Month of July before they can make themselves compleatly Masters of Oran.
