Her Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the 27th of this Instant, should be further prorogued to Thursday the 12th Day of October next.

Hanover, July 27, N. S. The 23d M. HIS Majesty's Plate of One Hundred Guineas will be run for on Monday the 4th of September next, on the Round Course on the South Side, of Lincoln, by any Horse, Mare or Gelding, being no more than six Years old the Grads before, carrying 12 Stone, three Heats; to be shewn and entered at Mr. Thomas Gray's, at Waddington, on Saturday in the Evening before they run; and if any Difference arise either in Betting or Running, the same to be determined by his Grace the Duke of Ancaster, or whom he shall appoint, according to such his Majesty's Orders as will be there produced. Subscribers to pay one Guinea Entrance, Non-Subscribers two. No Horse, Mare or Gelding shall be permitted to start for the Plate that every won the Baile Plate, and not to be run for except three Horses, &c. enter for the same. On Wednesday the 6th will be run for on the same Course, a Plate of 30 l. Value, by any Horse, &c. that never won a Plate before, and no more than five Years old last Grads, as must be certified under the Hand of the Breeder, to carry nine Stone, one Heat, and to pay two Guineas Entrance. On Thursday the 7th will be run for on the same Course, a Plate of 20 l. Value, by any Horse, &c. that never won above the Value of 10 Guineas at one Time, ten Stone, three Heats, and to pay two Guineas Entrance. Horses, &c. for the three last Plates, to be shewn and entered at Mr.

John Cook's, at the Red Lyon below Hill at Lincoln, on Saturday before Running, between the Hours of Six and Twelve in the Forenoon. On Friday the 8th will be run for on the same Course, a Gold Cup of ninety Pounds Value, called the Ladies Plate, by any Horse, &c. that was no more than six Years old last Grads, as must be certified under the Hands of the Breeder, nine Stone, three Heats.
