A PROCLAMATION,

Prohibiting his Majefty's Subjects from trading to the East Indies, contrary to the Liberties and Privibeges granted to the English East India Company, and from being unlawfully concerned in any Foreign Company or Society Trading to the East Indies.

Caroline R. C. R. THEREAS the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, by and under An Act of Parliament-made

in the Ninth Year of the Reign of his late Majefty King William the Third of Glorious Memory, intitled, An Act for raising a Sum not exceeding Two Millions upon a Fund for Payment of Annuities after the Rate of Eight Pounds per Centum per Annum, and for lettling the Trade to the East Indies ; and by and under feveral other Acts of Parliament, Letters Patent and Indentures, are entitled to have, use, and enjoy the whole and sole. Trade and Traffick, and the only Liberty and Privilege of trading, trafficking, and ex-ercising the Trade of Merchandize to and from the East Indies in the Countries and so taken, arrested, and feized, to fend and re-Parts of Afia and Africa, and to and from fuch Places of Afia, Africa and America, or any of them beyond the Cape of Bona Efperanza to the Straights of Magellan, where any Trade or Traffick of Merchandize is or may be used or had, the Trade whereof is appropriated to them by the faid Acts of Parliament, or one of them is by which Act of the Ninth Year. Commissions and for encouraging and further of them; by which Act of the Ninth Year Commissions, and for encouraging and further of the Reign of his late Majefty King Willi-den the Third, it is provided, That if any of the Subjects of his faid late Majefty, his Heirs, or Succeffors, of what Degree or Quality fo-fully go and trade to the Eaft Indies and the Parts in the fame Act mentioned by Indies or Parts aforefaid contrary to the Late other the Parts in the fame AA mentioned by Indies or Parts aforefaid, contrary to the Laws Virtue thereof, and their Factors, Agents and now in being, or contrary to the Tenor of

By the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, Offenders should incur the Forfeiture and Lofs of all the Ships and Veffels which thould be employed in fuch Trade, with the Guns, Tackle, Apparel and Furniture thereunto be-longing, and alfo all, the Goods and Mer-chandizes laden thereupon, and all the Pro-ceed and Effects of the fame, and alfo double the Value thereof, to be recovered as therein is particularly mentioned; and it is also provided by the dame Act, and by subsequent Laws, that all the Goods, Wares, Merchandizes and Commodities to be laden upon any Ship or Ships bound from the faid East In-dies, or Barts within the Limits aforefaid. should be brought without breaking Bulk to fome Port of Great Britain, there to be un-laden and put on Land. And whereas by an Act paffed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of his late. Majefty King George the Firft, of Glorious Memory, which Act was revived and continued by an Act of the laft Seffion of Parliament, it it enacted, That, the faid United Company of Merchants of England Trading to the East Indies, and their Succeffors, should and might take, arreft and leized, or. caule to be taken, arrefted, and feized, fuch Perfon or Perfons, being a Sub-ject or Subjects of his Majefty, his Heirs or Succeffors, at any Place or Places where he or they should be found within the Limits or Places aforefaid, and the Perfon or Perfons virtue thereor, and their factors, Agents and Servants refpectively employed according to the true Meaning of the faid Act, fhould di-rectly or indirectly vifit, haunt, frequent, trade, traffick or adventure into or from the faid Eaft Indies, or other the Parts aforefaid, contrary to the true Intent and Meaning thereof, all and every fuch Offender and Weftminster, one or more Information or Information formations
