HE 30th of laft Month his Highnels Prince Ernest of Bevern took his Leave of his Majesty, and set out the fame Day for Brunfwick, being extreamly fatisfied with the Reception he had met with during his Stay here, M. Kutzell, who is fent hither on the Part of the Duke of Saxe Eifenach, to compliment the King on his Arrival in his German Dominions, had the 31ft his Audience of his Majesty. Letters from Berlin of the 29th of July, N.S. advile, that his Pruffian Majefty let out the 27th early in the Mor\* ning for the Frontiers of Silefia and Bohemia, to have an Interview with the Emperor. This Morning between Seven and Eight a-Clock, the King, accompanied by his Highness Prince George of Hesse, and attend d by my Lord Harrington, the Foreign Min sters, and feveral other Perfons of Diffinction, went to Butzenburg Forest, where the Peafants had brought into the Toils feveral wild Beafts, and his Majesty having diverted himself with shooting fome wild Boars, Foxes, and Hares, returned about Seven a-Clock in the Evening to Herrenhaulen.

Hague, Aug. 5, N.S. The King of Pruffia and the Prince of Naflau Orange having lately concluded an Accommodation between themfelves upon their feveral Claims to the Inheritance of the late King William, agreed to notify the fame by Letters to the States General, which were prefented to their High Mightinefles on the 1ft Inftant. The fame Day the Prince of Naffau Orange arrived here, and has fince been with the Principal Persons in the Administration of this Republick, who have returned his Vifits.
