H E 3d Inftant in the Evening, his Highnels Prince George of Helle took his Leave of his Majesty, and dined Yefterday with Count Platen, and then fet out for Butzaw, to make a Vilit to his Sifter the Dutchess Dowager of Mecklenbourg. Yellerday in the Afternoon Count Degenfelt, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Pruffia to the Court of Great Britain, arrived here from England. This Morning M. Dieden, his Majeity's Minister as Elector, to the Emperor, returned from hence to Prague, where the Imperial Court now refides. M. Brumer, who came hither on the Part of the Duke of Holftein, to compliment the King on his Arrival in his German Do-minions, took his Leave of his Majesty last Night, and fet out this Morning for the Court of the Duke his Mafter.

Hague, Aug. 8, N. S. The Prince of Naf-fau Orange, who deligned to have palled Ten or Twelve Days here, having received an Express Yesterday from an extraordinary Assembly of the States of Friesland, fet out this Morning in order to repair thither. Letters that came in to Day from Seville advile, that a ftrong Garrison being to be left in Oran, the reft of the Spanish Forces were about to return to Spain, Orders being already given for embarking the Horfe. .
