Genoua, Scptember 7.

Rom Turin we are told, that Monfieur Gaumont is arrived there, in quality of En-voy extraordinary from his most Christian Majeity, to offer the Mediation of the King his Master, for the making up the prefent Breach between us and that Duke, he is like wile fuddainly expected here on the fame errand, fo that after all, we hope by the Authority of hisfaid Majefty, to fee Peace reftored again. In the mean time the Forces of this State are withdrawn from the Frontiers, and our Galleys are at present in Port, where they are careening, in order to their putting to Sea again. The French Galleys are still at Villa Franca, expetting there the Orders of the Duke of Savoy how to proceed ; Several French Prifoners baving been lately br ought hither, which had beenta-ken in the Service of the Duke of Savoy, the Senate immediately in civility to that Nation, ordered them to be released, and furnished with all necessaries, farther providing them a Gally for their transportation to France. The Galleys of Naple's past by here some days fince on their return from Spaine towards that Kingdom. We daily expect here an Envoy from the Crown of Spain, who is dikewile to labor for an, accommodation. It is faid, that the Duke d'Ofuna Governor of Milan, is continued in that Government for three years longer.

Halberstadt, Sept. 7. The Elector of Branden-Burgh expects here still the arrival of the Imperial Troops, which being come to Erfort, will, as we are told, continue there, till such time as General Montecuculi shall have been here, to adjust with the faid Bleftor, some Points concerning the intended conjunction which being done, they may proceed on their march towards this place, which it is hoped they will reach yet towards the latter end of this week, and that then we shall see a confiderable Army here : The March Grief of Biden, the Duke of Wolffenbuttel, the two D ikes of Homburg, together with feveral other perfons of the most eminent quality, are at present here : the Duke of Saxen Lawenburgh who accompanied his Electoral Highness of Brandenburg hither, is fince gone hence on his return home. The old Duke of Lorrain is likewife here, and kath, as is faid, offered the Elector of Brandenburgh 10000 Men to joyn with his Troops, of which, two Regiments are already on their march under the Command of the young Count of Waldesh. The Brandenburgh Troops at prefent here, make up in all 24000 Men, besides those that are gone to Lipflidt and Minden with the Artillery; all this while we expect with much impatience to see how tar the Imperial Forces will proteed; fome report, that after the aforefaid conjunction, they wilk march direft'y towards Westphaliz, to attack the Bishop of Munster, but herein they seem to flatter themselves, as they would have it, the general opinion being quite otherwile.

Hambrough, Sept 9. At Harborgb, within two Leagues of this place, feueral Danish Troops we hear, begin to come together, not without giving us fome jealoufie; upon which our Guards here have been doubled, the Burgers are for the future to watch themfelves, five Companies at a time, and all thing put into a pofture of defence, though we cannos think that the King of *Deamark* has at prelent ant defigne in hand againft us, but rather, that thely Troops are to be drawn out of thele parts for longe other fervice.

Cologne, Sept. 13. Here is arrived the Marquis "de Peffiere, Maifire de Camp of the Regiment of Turenne, having been difpatched hither by !Monfieur de Turenne, and accordingly on Friday laft had Audience of our Magistrates, the particulars of his Errand are not faid, fatcher, then that it is to let this Government know, on what terms his Majefly will grant them a Neutrality in cale they fhall defire it : From Wefel we have advice, that the ninth inflant Monfieur Turenne paffed the Rhyn there with his whole Army, which confifts of above 400000 Men, and that it was thought, he would march towards the Land of Marck, or elie come on towards the Rhyn, to meet the German Forces.

Gronningen, Sept. 13. We have not for fome days, had any news of the motions of the Bishop of Munfter; the news of the coming down of the Auxiliary Troops, having made him, as is thought, hasten his march towards Westphalia, to take care for the deferce of his Countrey. Here is at present prisoner the Sicur Rengers, who is said to have Treated with the Bishop, when he lay before this place, concerning the betraying it into his hands; the Court of Justice is about forming his Process, so that he may now fuddarily be cleared or condemned.

Maestricht, Sept. 13. Here have been lately brought hither by a party of our Cavalry, eight Waggons, laden with Wool and other Merchandises, belonging to the Inhabitants of Liege, two of which have been fince released by order of our Governor. On Saturday last arrived here the Sieur Mean from Liege, being deputed by that Chapter, to complain of the Hossilities that are daily committed, and of the great Contribution that is exacted from the Gountrey people, and to defire a forbearance, till the fuccess of their Deputies negotiation, at the Hague is known. This Morning several French Troops appeared again within fight of this place being supposed to be those lately come from Charleroy, and defigned for Masser. We cannot heat, any thing farther of the march of the German Troops; the Imperialiss are faid to be at Erfort, and the Brandenburgh Forces at Halbersfadt, expecting their arrival there.

Bruffels, Sept. 16. On Wednelday laft his Excel², lency, accompanied with Count Marcyn, and lever ral other perfons of the chiefeft quality, went hence for Mars, ¹Henegaw, Ge. to fee in what condition things are there, and returned bither again the laft night.
