ON the 26th at Noon the King arrived here from Herrenhausen, and was attended and complimented by the Supreme Court of Justice, and a great Number of the Nobility of this Country. After Dinner his Majesty went to his Stables in this City, and entertained himself with viewing his Horses. At Night there was a numerous and splendid Appearance of both Sexes at Court. The same Day the Right Honourable the Lord Harrington arrived here, as did likewise several of the Foreign Ministers, a great many of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction, from Hanover. The 27th about Nine in the Morning, his Majesty, attended by the whole Court, went to Sprake Forrest, about a German Mile from this Place, where having taken the Diversion of spearing several wild Boars, and of shooting several Foxes and Hares, he returned hither about Six in the Evening. His Highness Prince George of Hesse arrived here the same Day in the Afternoon from Butzaw, whither he went some Weeks ago to make a Visit to his Sister the Dutchess Dowager of Mecklenburg, and in the Evening he waited on his Majesty. On the 28th, about Eight in the Morning, his Majesty, attended by Prince George of Hesse, the Right Hon. the Lord Harrington, the foreign Ministers, and the whole Court, went to a Plain about an English Mile from this Place, and made a general Review of three Regiments of Horse, commanded by the Colonels Horn, Walter, and Dreves, consisting each of six Squadrons, and 150 Men in each Squadron; and of four Regiments of Foot commanded by Major General Lucius, Brigadier General Roeden, and the Colonels Rantzau, and Soubiron, consisting of four Battalions, and each of 700 Men. The Horse went through their several Evolutions

on Horseback, charged each other several Times, dismounted, formed into Battalions, performed their manual Exercise and Firings, remounted, and marched by his Majesty in Squadrons. And Yesterday the Foot performed their Exercise, Evolutions, and Firings, formed the Square, and reduced it. His Majesty expressed his entire Satisfaction with the fine Appearance the several Regiments made, and also with the great Exactness and Regularity of the Performance of their Exercise, Evolutions, and Firings. His Majesty was saluted both Days by the Artillery at his coming and going.
