THE 3d Instant the King and the whole Court took the Diversion of Stag Hunting in the Forest. The 4th his Majesty reviewed the Troops cantoned in this Neighbourhood, viz. the Brigadiers General Schultz's and Busch's Regiments of Horse, and Feldt Marshal Bulow's Regiment of Dragoons; and four Regiments of Foot, commanded by Brigadier General Behr, and the Colonels d'Amproux, Wrangel, and Clinckaufstrom. After which, the Horse and Dragoons went through all their Evolutions, Exercises, and Firings, as well on Horseback as on Foot: And Yesterday the Foot went also through their Exercises, Evolutions, and Firings. His Majesty was extremely well pleased with the fine Appearance the several Regiments made, and with the exact and regular Performance of their Exercises and Firings. This Morning his Majesty and the whole Court left this Place for Hanover.

Hanover, Sept. 7, N. S. Yesterday about Three in the Afternoon the King arrived

at his Palace in this City from the Gohrde, in perfect Health, and supped in Publick. His Majesty has fixed his Departure from hence for England on Monday the 22d Instant, N. S.
