HIS Majesty has been pleased to promote the Grand Marshal Hardenberg to the Office of President of the Chamber of Finances; and to appoint the Count of Oynhausen his Grand Veneur, and M. Frischapple Great Master of the Horse. On Tuesday last the King presented Mr. Thomas Briand, an Englishman and a Painter in Miniature, with a fine Gold Medal, he having had the Honour to draw his Majesty's Picture here to the general Satisfaction of the Court. The 10th at Noon the Baron de Beveren, Privy Counsellour and Grand Marshal to the Elector Palatine, and President of Ecclesiastical Affairs, who was sent hither in July last on the Part of his Serene Highness to compliment the King on his Arrival in his German Dominions, had his Audience of Leave of his Majesty, and returned in the Evening to the Court of his Master the Elector Palatine. The same Day in the Evening the Opera House in the Palace was illuminated, and his Majesty and the whole Court were present at a French Comedy acted there, which was followed at Night by a Masquerade.
