HE States of Holland have been these two Days settling the Nomination to the vacant Offices that are at their Disposal. Their Assembly wil continue fitting to the End of next Week. The Command of a Regiment is become weant by the Death of the Baron de Vizouze, vho was also a Lieutenant-General: He died here this Morning. That Regiment is at the Disposal of the States of the Province of Zealand. M. Hop is expected here this Evening from Hanover. To-morrow a Yacht will be sent to Utrecht to wait the Lord Harrington's Arrival there, and to bring his Lordship hither. A Prince of the House of Baden Dourlach, Nephew of the Prince of that Name now possessing that Territory, who has been here some Months solliciting the Command of a Troop or Company, received Advice the other Day of his being appointed a Colonel of a Regiment of one of the Circles; whereupon he has taken his Leave of the

States. His younger Brother stays behind him, and will probably obtain the Commission he applied for. The Lady Portland is gone from hence to Aix la Chapelle.
