A Detachment of the Troops of this Garrison which were at the late Camp near Warlaw, are come back hither, extremely satisfied with the King of Poland's Liberality towards them: He made very valuable Presents to each Officer, and gave every Soldier two Months Pay over and above what was due to him. We have Advices from Warlaw, that the Deputies nominated to assist at the General Diet, which is to be held there before the End of this Month, are many of them already arrived there, and that it was rumoured the King designs to declare Mr. Poniatowski Crown General, but it was believed several Deputies will hardly be brought to consent to it. M. de Tarlo, late Bishop of Polmania, has by his Will left his Library to the Jesuits of that Place, and a considerable Sum towards the Maintenance of their College.

Berlin, Sept. 13. Orders have been dispatched to a considerable Number of Fortes to hold themselves in a Readiness to march upon the first Notice to quarter in the Country between the Oder and the Elbe. The Court is at Wusterhausen, whither Count Seckendorff, M. de Munckhausen, and Baron de Ginkel, repaired on the 9th Instant. The Count de Lewolde, Master of the Horse to the Czarina, arrived there on the 10th.

The next Day the King went a Stag-hunting; after which the Anniversary of the Battle of Malplaquet, in which his Majesty was personally, was celebrated by a great Entertainment, to which his Majesty invited his Ministers and General Officers. The Court will remain some Weeks at Wusterhausen, which the King is resolv'd to enlarge by new Buildings.

Hague, Sept. 19. Letters from Copenhagen of the 9th Instant give an Account, that Mr. Titley, his Britannick Majesty's Minister, being returned thither from Hanover, had a private Audience of the King of Denmark soon after he arrived. The Lady Portland set out from hence some Days ago for Aix la Chapelle.
