**T**HE States of Holland are to assemble next Wednesday, and the Commissioners of the Admiralties are come hither in order to settle with their Deputies the new Duties of Importation and Exportation. The King of Prussia has recalled M. Meinerthagen, Nephew of the late Envoy of that Name, whom he made his Resident here but a little while ago. The States of Holland persist in refusing to admit M. Luiscius whom his Prussian Majesty would appoint to succeed the said M. Meinerthagen, because they look upon him as their own Subject, he having married a Dutch Woman, and been settled a long Time in this Country. The three Plenipotentiaries employed by the Prince of Nassau-Orange in his Accommodation with the King of Prussia, have received a Present from his Prussian Majesty of 12000 Livres to be divided between them; the Prince of Orange having given to each of the three Prussian Plenipotentiaries a Ring of considerable Value. Orders are sent to General Hompefch to break up the Camp at Oosterhout at soon as he shall think convenient, on account of the Rains.

*Helvoetsluys, Oct. 1, N. S.* His Majesty having set out from Hanover on Thursday the 25th of last Month, N. S. very early in the Morning, came that Night to Bentheim, and the next Day to Utrecht, from whence his Majesty arrived here on Saturday the 27th (God be praised) in perfect Health. The Yachts and Men of War under the Command of the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Torrington, that are to attend his Majesty in his Passage to England, have been here several Days, and his Majesty will embark with the first fair Wind.

East-India House, Sept. 20, 1732.
