Lints, September 21, N. S.

THE Emperour and Empress returned to this Place on Friday last in the Evening, very well satisfied with their late Diversions of hunting, and in very good Health. There is Advice from Vienna, that the Eldest Arch-dutchess is somewhat indisposed. The Baron Diede, his Britannick Majesty's German Minister at this Court, went from hence on Thursday last to return to Vienna. And last Night the Duke de Liria, Minister of Spain, came from Vienna hither. The Emperour will on Friday next set out for Steyer, the Capital Town of Stiria, about Four German Leagues from this Place, after which his Imperial Majesty designs to visit some other Places in that Neighbourhood, and return hither on the Tuesday following. The next Day being the First of October, N. S. and the Emperour's Birth-Day, will be celebrated here

with great Solemnity; and the Departure of the Court, on their return Home, is fixed to the Third of October.

Berlin, Sept. 26, N. S. The Count de Lewolde, Minister from the Czarina, is gone to Halle. Count Seckendorff, Minister from the Emperour, is gone to the Court of Denmark, and is expected back here in six Weeks. In November his Prussian Majesty designs to make a Progress into Pomerania, there to take the Diversion of hunting the wild Boar. 'Tis advised from Petersbourg, that the Czarina returned the 8th of last Month from a Journey which she had taken to see the Canal of Ladoga, which is 104 Wersts in length, 70 Foot broad, and 10 deep; and that her Majesty had ordered two Pyramids to be erected, one at the Place where that Canal enters the Lake of Ladoga, and another near Schlüsselbourg, where it enters into the River of Narva.
