And as your Majefty has been gracioufly pleafed, upon many Occafions, to fhew an ef-pecial Regard for the Profperity of your Ci-ty of London, we are under the higheft Obligations, and beg Leave to affure your Majefty of our moft hearty Attachment to your Royal Perfor and Covernment of the your Royal Person and Government, of the utmost Endeavours in our Sphere to promote an affectionate Zeal for your Majefty's Ser-vice, that your Reign may be easy and hap-py, most fincerely wishing the Continuance

of your Majefty's Health, your long Life and Increase of Honour and Glory.
