ARON Sparre arrived here on Saturday the 16th Instant, and was very D gracioufly received by their Majefties. Yefterday their Swedifh Majefties fet out to accompany Prince William of Heffe as far as Grimtholm, about feven Swedifh Miles from this Place. They dined at Prefident Hop-kens's, which is in the Way, about two Miles off. His Hicknefe will proceed on his Journey off. His Highness will proceed on his Journey this Day Seven-night; and the Court is ex-pected back the latter End of next Week.

Hague, Oct. 14, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland will allemble To-mor-tow. M. Hop has taken his Leave of the States, defigning for Zealand in a Yacht To-morrow in the Afternoon, where he propoles to flay two or three Days, and will proceed to England by the Way of Calais. The Losses by the late Storms prove fo great, that about 50 Ships have been caft away between these Coaits and Hambourg, among which they reckon several English. M. Meinertsbagen, Refident from the King of Pruffia, is ordered by his Court to prepare to go to Sweden, to relide there.
