*Stockholm, September 20, O. S.*

**B**ARON Sparre arrived here on Saturday the 16th Instant, and was very graciously received by their Majesties. Yesterday their Swedish Majesties set out to accompany Prince William of Hesse as far as Grimsholm, about seven Swedish Miles from this Place. They dined at President Hopkens's, which is in the Way, about two Miles off. His Highness will proceed on his Journey this Day Seven-night; and the Court is expected back the latter End of next Week.

*Hague, Oct. 14, N. S.* The States of the Province of Holland will assemble Tomorrow. M. Hop has taken his Leave of the States, designing for Zealand in a Yacht Tomorrow in the Afternoon, where he proposes to stay two or three Days, and will proceed to England by the Way of Calais. The Losses by the late Storms prove so great, that about 50 Ships have been cast away between these Coasts and Hambourg, among which they reckon several English. M. Meinertshagen, Resident from the King of Prussia, is ordered by his Court to prepare to go to Sweden, to reside there.

*Kensington, October 5.*

This Day the Conde de Montijo, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of Spain, had his first private Audience of His Majesty; to which he was introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clément Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonies.

He had afterwards a private Audience of Her Majesty; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Grantham Her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain, and conducted by the Master of the Ceremonies.

*Kensington, Oct. 6.* This Day his Excellency the Conde de Montijo had a private Audience of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.

And afterwards a private Audience of His Royal Highness the Duke.

From whom he went to a private Audience of their Royal Highnesses the Princess Royal, the Princesses Amelia and Caroline, and the Princesses Mary and Louisa; being introduced by the Master of the Ceremonies.
