Petersbourg, September 22.

THE Four Regiments of Foot which have encamped this Summer near this City, broke up the 16th Instant and returned to their Quarters. The same Day, the Festival of the Princess Elizabeth's Name-Day, was celebrated at the Palace. M. de Westphalen, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark, had on the 18th a publick Audience of the Czarina, in which he declared to her, in the Name of the King his Master, that his Danish Majesty acknowledged her in Quality of Empress. Her Czarish Majesty was placed under a most magnificent Canopy, being attended by the principal Officers of the Court, the Generals, and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes. The Knees Tscherbourow, lately returned from Constantinople, where he had resided in Quality of Envoy Extraordinary from the Czarina, had some Days ago the Honour to kiss her Majesty's Hand, and made a Report to her Majesty of the Success of his Negotiation, and delivered

to her at the same time his Recredential Letters. The Talk of the Marriage of the young Princess of Mecklenbourg is again revived, but the Prince who is designed for her is not yet named. Her Czarish Majesty intends in a little time to make a great Promotion among the General Officers. The Prince of Hesse Hombourg is upon his Departure to go and take upon him the Command of the Troops in Persia, which her Majesty has conferred upon him.

Stockholm, Sept. 30. The King returned Yesterday from Ulrichsal with Prince William of Hesse his Brother, who had put off his Departure in order to accompany his Majesty at a great Party of Hunting. His Highness will set out towards the End of this Week, his Domesticks being already gone.

Vienna, Oct. 4. The first Instant the Anniversary of the Emperour's Birth-Day was celebrated here with the usual Ceremonies. We have Advices from Lintz, that their Imperial Majesties were returned thither from a little Journey they had made towards Ens, and that their Majesties intended to set out from that Place



Place as To-morrow or the Day after for this City. Prince Eugene of Savoy, the Duke of Liria, the Marquess de Perlas, and some other Foreign Ministers, arrived here Yesterday from Lintz.

Warsaw, Oct. 4, N. S. The Diet ended on Thursday the 2d Instant, the fifteen Days being expired which is the limited Time for extraordinary ones. On Tuesday his Polish Majesty seemed determined to dispose of the vacant Generalships at all Events; however he sent four Senators to the Chamber of the Nuncios to sound their Sentiments, since according to a late Constitution those Employments ought to be given in full Diet, which could not be for want of a Marshal's being elected. The greatest Part of the Nuncios desired his Majesty would notwithstanding dispose of those Offices, but the rest protested against it. The same Day his Majesty consulted the Senators who were present in his Antichamber, what was proper to be done, and finding very different Opinions, required to have them in Writing that Night, which every one sent him; and he did not declare himself till Thursday, during which Interval Things were in the utmost Fermentation; when to quiet them, he declared, that since the Members of this Diet could not agree, he would not dispose of the Vacancies before another Diet. It is now under Consideration whether they shall have another extraordinary Diet the Beginning of next Year, which is entirely in the Breast of the King. The Senatus Consultum is to meet on Monday, after which it will be more certainly known; but it is generally thought his Majesty will assemble one in the Month of February or March, and in the mean time go to Dresden. M. de Dieu, Minister from the States Gene-

ral at the Court of Russia, has passed through this Place in his Way Home.

Berlin, Oct. 7, N. S. M. Marshall de Biberstein, his Prussian Majesty's Minister at the Court of Poland, is recalled; and it is thought he will be succeeded by M. Ludewitz, who is on his Return from Sweden. The Prince of Bareuth arrived at Wusterhausen two Days ago.
