Petersbourg, September 30, O. S.

THE High Water we had here the 15th Instant has done a great deal of Damage at Crownstادت, having destroyed above 50 Fathom of the great Canal that has been building for some Years to lead to a Bafon, near which there were to be six dry Docks. A large Russia Merchant Ship that was going to Amsterdam, was lost the Day of the high Water between Crownstادت and Hogland, and several English Ships were obliged to put back to Crownstادت, but none were lost nor suffered any considerable Damage.

Berlin, Oct. 25, N. S. Yesterday Morning the King of Prussia came to Town, and dined at Major General Sido's; after which he was present at a German Comedy, and about Nine in the Evening he returned to Wufferhausen. Count Degenfelt has taken his Leave of the King, and will set out in a few Days on his Return to the Court of Great Britain, from whence he will return hither the next Spring.

Hague, Oct. 31, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland separated Yesterday to re-assemble on Tuesday Sevensight. The Admiralties have likewise separated without having come to any Resolution with Regard to the Regulations of the new Tariff. The Directors of the East India Company have been here, according to Custom, to present the Accounts of their Administration during four Years to the States General, who having approved thereof, they are returned to Amsterdam. The Prince of Nassau-Orange is expected here in a few Days.
