Edenburgh, Sept.12.

Have not troubled you of late with the accounts of what hath been doing here, fince I'know that the news of the actions of Fleets and Armies wherein we have fo great concern, hath fwaldowed up the confideration of all things elfe. Bur I must now tell you, that the Parliament of this Kingdom have been conftantly busie fince the Lord Commissioners coming hither, except for one fortnight, and that they have past many excellent Laws, to the great fatisfaction of the whole Kingdom, and all with very great unanimity in the Parliament, a List whereof I lend you by this. Now the Parliament is Adjourned to the fecond Wedneiday of June 1673. and his Grace the Lord Commissioner is preparing for his return to Court, after he hath feen all things concerning the fecurity of the Kingdom ordered in Council, which will be in few days.

- Belides thele publick Acts, there are many private Acts of great Juffice, and great concern to the Parties, of which I think it not necessary to fenda Lift,

but this lets you fee, that this Seffion of Parliament hath been very close at work, and that our Conslitu-tion is expeditious.

Warfaw, Aug. 24. There Majestiesare still at Fa-nomites, and will continue there till the 30 instant, by which time it is hoped the Nobility will be-gin to appear in the Field, and in the interim, a Bridge of Boats is making over the Viftula, for the paffage of the Nobility of those Palatinates that lie on the other fide. Our Magistrates taking notice that a great many of the Inhabitants here, were upon the news of the approach of the Turkith Forces, retired with their Families and Goods towards Dantzick, and those other parts, to avoid the dany ger, which they apprehended now threatens this Kingdom, have caused several Edicts to be published, by which they forbid any Inhabitant what foever to aremove from hence under pain of confilcation of all their Goods or Eftates. Two Turks having been lately taken near Breflaw, they declare that the Ottoman Army (which they left part on this, and part on the other fide of the Neffre) was very numerous, under the Command of the Grand Vizier. The Grand Mareschal Sobietski is full at Limbergh, endeavoring to recruit his Forces there, which at prefent are in a very ill condition. It is faid that the King having written to the Elector of Brandenburgh concerning the fuccors he is obliged to fend this Crown, in cale of any danger from the Turks; that the faid Elector hath promited to have 1000 Foot and 500 Horle ready for us against the middle of the next month, but this does not fatisfy our Ministers, his Electoral Highness being obliged by Treaty, to furnish 6000 Men effective upon demand. The Coffacks in the Ukrain who have always adhered to the interest of this Crown, under the Command of Hanenko, have lately obliged themfelves anew, by a folemn Oath, to live and die for the defence of the fame.

Ditto, Sept. 2. The Nobility begin now to appear at fanowits, thole of Lithuania are most arrived there, and the reft daily follow i, Yesterday the Nobility of the Palatinate of Lenicienfi, confilt-ing of 15 Troops, paffed by here towards Fanon wits; The Nobility of Cracovia and Sendomiria are ready to march, and only expect first the Nobility of Great Poland; This gives us new courage, and makes us hope, that after all, we may fee this King-dom in lome posture of defence. The news concerning the Siege of Caminiec, is confirmed again ; that the Turks had Stormed the place three times fucceffively, but were beaten off with confiderable lois, That they had thereupon quitted the Siege, and as was thought, taken other refolutions for their proceedings. The Muscowy Ambassadors are arfived at the Court at Fanowits, but have not as yet had Audience of the King; it is hoped they some to propole a Treaty for the mutual defence of both Crowns against the Turks.
