**Y**ESTERDAY being the Festival of St. Charles, the Emperor's Name-day, it was observed with the usual Solemnity; but the Opera intended to have been performed at Night, was put off on Account of his Imperial Majesty's finding himself a little indisposed. The Duke of Lorraine came hither on this Occasion.

*Hague, Nov. 18, N. S.* The States of Holland separated last Saturday, and are to meet again To-morrow Sen-night. The States have received a Letter from the Margrave of Dourlach, who seems to oppose the Distribution of the Effects of the late King William, in Favour of the Prince of Nassau-Orange, who is expected here next Saturday. The Commissioners of the Admiralties have been here some Days, and are endeavouring to remove the Difficulties which relate to the Regulation made lately upon the new Tarif. The Directors of the East India Company are expected here upon their own Affairs.

*Dublin, Oct. 31.* Yesterday being His Majesty's Birth-Day, the Great Guns were fired at the Barracks, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out upon Oxmantown Green. At Noon there was a numerous Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle to compliment their Excellencies the Lords Justices upon this Occasion; before whom a Song was performed: After which their Excellencies, attended with the Guard of Battle-Axes and a Squadron of Horse, made a Tour upon the Strand. In the Evening there was a Play given by their Excellencies for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

*Whitehall, November 11.*

On Thursday last about Two in the Afternoon, their Majesties and all the Royal Family removed from Kenfington to Richmond.

Ordered, That all Persons claiming to be Officers or Ministers of or within the Court of Chancery, Court of King's Bench, Court of Common Pleas, Court of Exchequer, Court of Exchequer Chamber, Courts held before the Justices of Assize, and of Nisi Prius, Justices of Oyer and Terminer, and Justices of Goal Delivery, Court of Admiralty, Court of Arches, Prerogative Court of Canterbury, the Vicar General of the Province of Canterbury, and the Master of the Faculties, the Consistory, and Chancery, and Exchequer, or Prerogative Courts of York, the Consistory and Commissary Courts of London, the Courts of the Quarter Sessions of the

several Counties in England, Do forthwith lay before the Commissioners (by leaving the same in Writing with Mr. Joshua Sharpe, the Secretary to this Commission, at his Chambers, No 6, Pump Court, in the Temple) an Account of the Nature of their respective Offices, and what Service, Charge and Attendance, doth belong unto each of them by Virtue of their respective Offices, and what Fees, Rewards and Wages, every of the said Officers, Clerks and Ministers, and their Substitutes or Under-Clerks, have and take for and in Respect of their several Offices and Places.
